FOUNDATION STUDIES PROGRAMME*

Who is this programme for?

- New Zealand secondary school Year 12 (NCEA Level 2), or
- Grade 11/12 (Asia), or
- Second/third year of senior high school, or equivalent
- For students who do not meet the requirements above, there is a Foundation Connect option.

To gain entry to a Victoria University of Wellington Undergraduate degree:

- Successfully complete 120 credits in the Foundation Studies Programme
- Achieve a minimum of 55% in English I, 60% in English IIA, 65% in English IIB and 50% in two other core subjects, equal to 60 credits
- Achieve 50% or higher in six optional subjects equal to 60 credits (300 marks out of a possible 600)

Foundation Connect**

Delivered by UP Education, Foundation Connect provides a comprehensive, English-rich curriculum to prepare students for the *Victoria University of Wellington Certificate in Foundation Studies. This six-month extension programme allows students to develop their English skills, confidence and apply these English skills in an academic setting. Foundation Connect includes engagement in Mathematics and academic courses to give students a broader foundation for future learning. Successfully complete this course and you can proceed to the *Victoria University of Wellington Foundation Studies Programme (Standard).

Pathways Link***

The Pathways Link Programme is a one-year programme designed specifically for international students aged 14-16 who have recently finished their junior high school education and aspire to study abroad. This programme aims to equip students with essential foundational knowledge, skills, and the confidence necessary to excel in the future Foundation studies.


Programme delivery

It's a symbol people recognise and trust - a trademark that embodies our values of kaitiaki, integrity, ingenuity - the values of our New Zealand Story.

History of the Silver Fern

The Silver Fern is one of New Zealand's most recognised, long-standing, and respected national symbols. Since the late 19th Century our fern has been worn with pride by our sports teams, with honour by our soldiers and used to represent our country all over the world. But why is the Silver Fern so special? Māori hunters and warriors would use the silver underside of the fern leaves to find their way. When bent over, the fronds would catch the moonlight and illuminate a path through the forest.

Today, the Silver Fern is still guiding the way, just as it has for over 150 years. The New Zealand Government and key private businesses have helped grow the FernMark into a recognisable and valuable icon. Tourism New Zealand and New Zealand Trade and Enterprise have also adopted the Silver Fern as the country of origin symbol for New Zealand. And now, the FernMark gives us the opportunity to represent New Zealand on the world stage and bring international students on a journey to our shores through our New Zealand Story.

Studying overseas is exciting and rewarding – but sometimes it can also be challenging. We are here to provide all the support and care students need to achieve their goals. The role of the Deans is to support the tutors and teaching staff by monitoring attendance and academic progress, and carrying out disciplinary measures where required. If a teacher has a concern about a student, they talk to their tutor first, followed by the dean if necessary. Our teachers, tutors and deans work together closely to ensure students are happy and thriving.

Caring for your health & wellbeing

We have staff trained and registered with Red Cross for minor health and wellbeing issues at the International College. If students need further medical treatment, a doctor is available by appointment.

Studentsafe insurance for international students

The Education (Pastoral Care of Tertiary and International Learners) Code of Practice 2021 requires all international students studying in New Zealand to have appropriate health and travel insurance during their period of study and covering the duration of their visa.

ACCOMMODATION

Homestay

Available to all students, homestay is a great way of experiencing New Zealand culture and practising your English every day.

You will have your own room with a bed, desk, lamp and Wi-Fi, and all meals are included for full-board homestay option. Laundry is also included.

- All homestays are thoroughly checked - the family is interviewed and the home inspected.
- All homestay providers sign a contract agreeing to rules and standards and undergo a vetting procedure by New Zealand Police.
- All students under 18 are visited in their accommodation quarterly by Authorised accommodation assessors.
- All payments to the homestay provider are made via the UP Education Student Fees Trust
- A 24-hour call centre number is provided in case of emergency

Other accommodation options

You could also choose to:

- Live with your parents
- Live with a designated caregiver (relative or family friend)
- Live in the student apartments (for students 18 and over only - this is the responsibility of the student or their parent/guardian or agent to arrange).
- Live in Victoria University of Wellington Halls of Residence accommodation. Please note that this only applies to student who are over 18 years old and that you must book independently through the website stating that you are a Foundation Studies Programme student: <https://www.wgtn.ac.nz/accommodation/halls>. You should also do so as early as possible as capacity is limited.

If you are under 18 at the start of your course, your accommodation arrangements must be approved by us.

The UP English Language Test (UPELT) has been developed to provide prospective students with an opportunity to quickly obtain an English language score prior to enrolment into a programme of their choice.

The test is facilitated online by highly qualified and experienced staff. It consists of computer-based, hand-written, and examiner-led tasks. Test description and instructions for test preparation are made available to all prospective candidates in advance, and a practice test is provided. Measures are taken to ensure the integrity of the test.

The UPELT is facilitated every Wednesday afternoon (1pm NZ Standard Time). Bookings can be arranged through the UP Admissions Team, admissions@up.education.
